I. YOUTH ASSOCIATIONS IN MECKLENBURG-VORPOMMERN

1. WHAT DO YOUTH ASSOCIATIONS OFFER?

What is a youth association?

A youth association is a community of young people who share certain interests. These young people get together to:

- spend some of their free time with like-minded people
- have fun
- get involved in free time activities and have their say on how they are run
- represent their own interests – sometimes in the political sphere
- run seminars and workshops that take place outside of school and work

The focus is always on what interests the young members. Because young people have all sorts of different interests, there are all sorts of different youth associations. Within these associations, decisions are taken democratically by the young members themselves. Everything is self-organised. The few adults involved in the associations are there to provide support. Youth associations are a voluntary activity. Their members are generally aged between 12 and 26 years old.

And you can join in too!

What do youth associations do?

Youth associations arrange all sorts of different activities. Virtually all of the associations you can join offer the following activities and you can even get involved with organising them:

- Youth group meetings
- Workshops, seminars and other educational events
- Holiday clubs
- Meet-ups for young people

- Group trips and excursions
- Committees (selected groups who make certain decisions, organise the work of the association and represent the association externally)

Some youth associations, in particular youth clubs, also run open meet-ups. And sometimes youth associations take to the streets to demonstrate and make their voices heard.

Who runs youth associations?

The free time and education activities offered by youth associations are primarily organised and run by volunteers who use their free time to get involved in their community. Most of the volunteers in youth associations are young people themselves. The few adults involved in the associations are either also volunteers or employees of the association. Being an employee generally requires special training or a degree. Associations also pay outside organisers to come in for certain events and activities.

Train to be a youth leader!

The young volunteers at youth associations have often undergone a brief training programme, known as the „JuLeiCa“ (or youth leader card) programme. This card lets you lead youth groups and oversee their free time activities. And you can get one too! The programme lasts 35 hours and covers aspects of education and law. You also have to take a First Aid course. If you are additionally involved in a youth association as a volunteer, you will also get the Youth Leader Card (JuLeiCa).

Where do the youth associations get their money from?

Jugendverbände finanzieren ihre Arbeit
Youth associations largely finance their work and their activities using money from the government. However, they do not belong to the government and are independent of the state. They also frequently receive extra money from charitable foundations or donations. Lots of members of youth associations also pay a membership fee. Bigger activities (such as holiday clubs, trips) usually require participants to pay a fee. However, there are often discounts available for those who need it.

What is a Youth Council?

Youth Councils bring together youth associations and other youth work organisers to form a volunteer working community. Youth Councils exist at various levels of government:

- At the Federal level, you have the German Federal Youth Council

- In the 16 federal states (Bundesländer), you have Regional Youth Councils like the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern
- Many districts and (larger) towns and cities have District, City and Local Youth Councils
- The individual Youth Councils generally cooperate closely

The employees of the Youth Councils provide a variety of services, in particular for their member associations. They are experts who provide support and inspiration. The Youth Councils also bring together the interests of their members and represent them externally. This means they act as political lobbyists for children and young people. Youth Councils also act as points of contact for young people who are interested. More information on what the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern does can be found in the second part of this brochure.

On the next few pages, you can read about the different youth associations that are members of the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern. The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is a working community for the 20 regional youth associations who are active across Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, one affiliate association and the Regional Congress of the City and District Youth Councils who have come together to advocate for the interests of young people. The Council also cooperates with Sportjugend Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, the Young People's Sports Association, to advocate for the concerns of children and young people.

As a body that represents and is made up of pupils, trainees, apprentices, students and young workers, DGB-Jugend also puts pressure on politicians and businesses, advocating for sufficient training opportunities and jobs for young people, for example. We also fight for decent work and fair pay.

What do we stand for?

We stand for solidarity! Trade unions represent the interests of all workers,

including trainees and apprentices. We also campaign on behalf of job-seekers. As an independent workers organisation, our sole responsibility is to our members and we help to shape the world of work by campaigning for social justice.



Who are we?

Who are we?

The Jugendfeuerwehr (Youth Fire Service) is the youth branch of the Volunteer Fire Service. There are 753 municipalities in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, of which more than 699 have their own Youth Fire Service with more than 10,300 girls and boys involved across the region. The Regional Youth Fire Service Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is the youth branch of the Regional Fire Service Association, the umbrella organisation bringing together all the youth fire services in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

What do we stand for?

The work of the Volunteer Fire Service in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is about serving your neighbours. That is what our members strive for. They want to take responsibility and support their community through our work. Our aim is not just to recruit and train the next generation for

active deployment (emergency response teams outside of the police), meaning future firefighters, but above all to promote youth work in general. Young firefighters learn expertise, practical skills, social skills and above all community spirit and camaraderie as a way of achieving the goals we set as a team. Regular classes, free time activities, competitions, camps, trips – all this and more awaits members of the Youth Fire Service.

What do we want?

Public services that are not covered by the police rely on volunteers, which is why training the next generation is such an important public concern. But volunteer firefighters do more than that. In addition to strengthening the common interest, it is important that they strengthen their social skills, pass down their knowledge and develop spaces where people can learn by experiencing. We see ourselves as a reliable partner



II. LANDESJUGENDRING MECKLENBURG-VORPOMMERN 1. ORGANIGRAMM

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern e.V. is a working group for the 20 regional youth associations who are active across Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, one affiliate association and the Regional Congress of the City and District Youth Councils. It is backed by youth associations with around 100,000 young members total, making LJR MV e.V. the largest representative body for children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, and the only one of its kind.

Head Committee

The Head Committee consists of selected representatives from member organisations, plus one member of the Regional Congress of the City and District Youth Councils and the Chair. The Chair and Managing Director have a consulting


vote. Each affiliate association may send one representative with a consulting vote. In between the General Meetings, the Head Committee manages all the duties of the Landesjugendring that are not explicitly reserved for the General Meeting. For example, it takes decisions on all projects, actions and campaigns of the Landesjugendring within the boundaries set out by resolutions of the General Meeting.

General Meeting

The General Meeting is the highest decision-making body. It consists of representatives of the member organisations.

- Overall planning and setting guidelines for the organisation's work
- Receiving the Chair's report, annual financial statements and audit report
- Electing the Chair
- Discharging the Chair
- Appointing the auditors
- Admitting and expelling member and affiliate associations
- Approving the rules of procedure
- Passing resolutions on scales of contributions
- Passing resolutions on amendments to the Articles of Association
- Passing resolutions on votes of no-confidence
- Passing resolutions on dissolving the body

Its duties include, in particular:



2. THE WORK OF THE LANDESJUGENDRING MECKLENBURG-VORPOMMERN

Youth Participation

Set up in 2001, the Beteiligungsnetzwerk MV/Participation Network MV (previously the Participation Campaign and Participation Network) is a project run by the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern. The network supports the participation of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern. It consists of regional facilitators who are active in districts and free cities in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, plus regional advisors. They provide help and support with participation projects.

The aim of the Participation Network MV is to promote the participation of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

In the longer term, this means:

- Making the participation of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern sustainable and anchoring participation consistently in all districts and free cities
- Specialist staff empowering children and young people to take advantage of opportunities to get involved across Mecklenburg-Vorpommern
- Actors involved in the participation of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern are in regular dialogue and have good networks across the region and beyond
- Actors involved in the participation of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern have the resources to empower young volunteers engaged with participation
- The rights of children and young people to inclusion are anchored in law

The Participation Network MV is here for anyone who is engaged with participation for children and young people and who needs help and support, specifically:

- Children and young people
- Volunteers and people working full-time with children and youth work, youth social work, school social work and educators
- Employees in public administration and holders of public office in local and regional politics

The Participation Network MV offers a variety of services related to participation for children and young people and digital inclusion:

- Overseeing participation processes and projects for children and young people (including digitally-assisted processes and projects): from basic ideas to design, and from concrete planning to financing and implementation
- Advice on working with digital tools
- Information on children's and young people's rights and the basics of participation for children and young people
- Providing and (further) developing methods of participation
- Offering and moderating events, training courses and workshops on the subject of participation for children and young people and digital participation

For example, the Participation Network MV helps children and young people to develop and implement their own project ideas at school, to represent the interests of young people or to set up a children and youth committee.

When it comes to politics, public administration and professionals, the Participation Network MV can offer support on partnerships and the participation of children and young people in the community, providing help by using suitable methods.

Digital participation for young people

Digital participation for young people has been affiliated with the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern since January 2022 and is now more heavily focused on the participation of children and young people in the digital environment. The job of the Digital Participation team is to help young people and professionals working in children and youth work, schools and public administration to use the tools provided by the digital environment to improve the participation of children and young people. They do this by running regular workshops, advice sessions and training courses. The Digital Participation team's „Talk & Tools“ podcast provides information on these issues via social media.

2. THEMEN DES LANDESJUGENDRINGS MECKLENBURG-VORPOMMERN

Volunteering

Youth work in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is only possible with the help of thousands of volunteers. Without their involvement and dedication, the wide range of activities and campaigns run by youth associations, clubs and initiatives in children and youth work simply would not be feasible.

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern advocates for young volunteers.



Juleica

The Youth Leader Card (JuLeiCa) is one of the areas the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern focuses on. The Landesjugendring runs regular courses on Legal and Insurance aspects with different JuLeiCa sponsors. The Chair and Office of the Landesjugendring also advocate for expanding and improving JuLeiCa benefits. In addition, the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern regularly reviews the training standards for the JuLeiCa within Mecklenburg-Vorpommern and in dialogue with others across Germany, adapting these standards to the lived reality of young people, taking into account relevant social issues.

International

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern advocates for international youth work! We also empower young people to get involved at an international level. And we are engaged in international youth policy. Our focus here is organised dialogue with young people from other countries. The formats vary enormously and include youth conferences, young people meet-ups, volunteer services and much more. Programmes can last a few days or a whole year. These types of activities give participants entirely new perspectives and insights, shedding light on the differences that exist within Europe and around the world and promoting mutual tolerance and solidarity. All of which young people find incredibly meaningful. At an international level, there are also political processes that are very important for young people. That is why the inclusion of young people is particularly significant in this arena, too.

Some of the ways in which the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern promotes all of this at an international level include:

- For young people: raising awareness of and advising on international meet-ups for young people, inclusi-

on processes and training programmes

- For youth associations, clubs and professionals: networking with potential cooperation partners at home and abroad, raising awareness of current funding programmes, training courses and useful information, advising on and supporting international activities and initiating and organising pilot projects and professional events
- With politics, public administration and other umbrella associations: lobbying for international youth work and inclusion, working together constructively on better international youth policy and advocating for better framework and funding conditions for international youth activities

Franco-German Youth Exchange (bilateral and trilateral)

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern signed a cooperation agreement with the Deutsch-Französischer Jugendwerk (Franco-German Youth Office, or DFJW for short) in May 2022. The aim of this cooperation is to establish long-term Franco-German and trilateral projects for extra-curricular activities in and with the State of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

Youth policy

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern represents the interests of young people in improving the living conditions of children and young people in the north-east of Germany with respect to politicians, public administration and the general public. In doing so, we pursue the following aims:

- Improving the living conditions of children and young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern
- Representing the interests of children, young people and young adults in politics, public administration and among the general public
- Helping to shape, secure and grow youth work in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern
- Creating and expanding opportunities for young people in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern to be included

Media learning

Children and young people have no problem communicating via digital media. While this allows them to have important experiences, the public debate frequently focuses exclusively on the dangers.

People working in youth work/youth associations have to be conscious that as people who children and young people trust, it is they who children and young people will go to if they ever have problems related to their use of media. Therefore, these people have to be able to navigate the media landscape of children and young people as a minimum.

For this reason, the Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern supports active media work and media learning at



youth associations and in other extra-curricular contexts within youth work in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

The Landesjugendring Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is a project partner on the Mediencounts MV project.

Holidays

Every year, the Landesjugendring publishes a holiday calendar for Mecklenburg-Vorpommern. This calendar provides information on the activities offered by countless organisations across Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, Germany and Europe. As public and independent bodies, all providers of the holidays listed in the calendar commit to uphold the standards of the Landesjugendring for children and young people's free time activities.
